#### **How to Qualify**

Players must be an ECF silver member or above for U18 and lower age groups, but a gold member or above for the U20 age group.

You can qualify for the 2023 EJCOA Youth Championships National Finals in one of three ways:

By winning your age section in a Regional Final of the EJCOA Youth Championships (one boy and one girl qualify from Under 8, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18 and 20 age groups).

1) By rating. Any player with a published current minimum ECF or FIDE standard play rating (as below) is entitled to enter the EJCOA National Youth Championships:

Under 8: 800

Under 10: 1000

Under 12: 1200

Under 14: 1400

Under 16: 1600

Under 18: 1700

Under 20: 1800

- 1) Wild Card entries. These players will be invited by the EJCOA Selection Committee, based on a combination of:
- A) Performance in an EJCOA Youth Championships Regional Final.
- B) Performance in other recent events.

Please note that all entries will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Capacity at Nottingham High School is limited to 150 players.
